METHODIST MEN TO COORDINATE CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKETS

This year, working with names provided by Bill Rafferty of the Interfaith Food Pantry, and Helen, our church secretary, UMM has set a goal of filling and distributing thirty Christmas food baskets to needy families in our community. Although UMM are coordinating this effort, we hope every one in the church family will want to help. After church today in Fellowship Hall, there will be sign up sheets to indicate ways you want to help: donate \$13 to defray the cost of a 5# canned ham, donate any amount of money from \$2 to as high as you want to go to help buy other items for the food basket, sign up to buy and bring a number of items for inclusion in the food baskets, sign up to help pack the food baskets, etc. These sign up sheets will be available for several weeks. We hope to involve as many members of the congregation as possible in this effort. Basket packing will take place on Saturday, December 17 and basket distribution is scheduled for the Monday before Christmas, December 19.

IDEAL CHRISTMAS GIFTS

Pete Pihos is donating much of the material and all of the labor for some ideal Christmas gifts for the person who has almost everything.
